



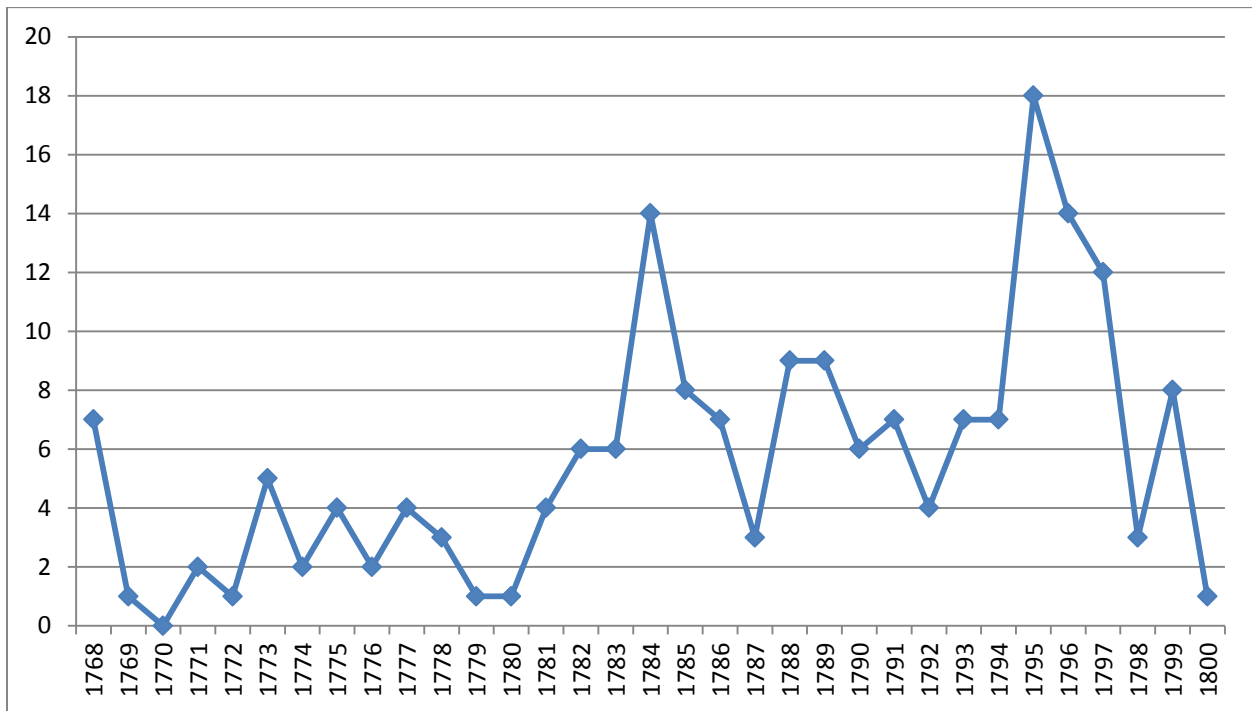
# Trinity Church on the Green, New Haven, Connecticut Marriage Records, 1768 - 1800, with an analysis of the data

The below table of marriage records is taken from Bailey, Frederic William, *Early Connecticut marriages as found on ancient church records prior to 1800*, Volume 7, Bureau of American ancestry, 1906, pp. 22-28. Bailey collected the records from the Parish Register of Trinity Episcopal Church. He notes that, "The records begin with the rectorship of the Rev. Bela Hubbard." Dr. Hubbard became rector of Trinity Church in 1767, and held that post until he died in 1812; he was the first rector to keep such records.

Some interesting data from the 186 records over the 32 years can be extracted from the table.

## 1. Frequency of Marriages over 32 years



Starting at about 7 marriages a year, there is a fall off during the Revolutionary War (1774-1783), with a sharp rise at the War's ending with about 7 marriages a year. There is a boom again in 1795-1797. Some of the boom-bust cycle may be due to the shipping and sealing industry. Historian Thomas Trowbridge notes that, "In the year 1790, Elijah Austin, an enterprising merchant of New Haven Conn.,

fitted out two vessels on sealing voyages for Falkland Island ...These were the first vessels that undertook the fur seal skin voyages for the China market. "<sup>1</sup> Marriages in the Colonial era were often delayed until age 26 when a young man could collect enough money to marry. The rapid rise in shipping, and the return of a ship full of relatively wealthy young men ready to settle down, may account for more than one of the marriages.

## 2. Most Popular Months for a New Haven Wedding

Sorting the marriage by months results in the following table:

This may be compared to today with the following percent: January 4.7%, February 7.0%, March 6.1%, April 7.4%, May 9.8%, June 10.8%, July 9.7%, August 10.2%, September 9.6%, October 9.4%, November 7.4% and December 7.8%.

It was more popular to marry at Trinity Church in the colder months: October, November, and January were the top months to marry, while today January is the least popular. Today, the most popular months to marry are June, August, and May, while in the Trinity Records May and August are the least popular dates.

This preference for late fall and early winter was possibly because in the 1790s ,New Haven was becoming a major port for shipping: as cash flush men on ships returned from trading, shipping and sealing voyages at the end of the safe sailing season between May and September, the winter months would be a good time to marry. While most trade was for coastal trade or the West Indies, the Neptune, a 350-ton, full-rigged sailing ship built at New Haven's Olive Street shipyard by Ebenezer Townsend, armed with 20 carriage guns and with a company of 45, sailed around the world 1796-1799. The seal

skins fetched \$3.25 each in Canton, netting the crew and its owner a total of \$280,000 -- a great sum in 1798. The return to the home part of cash rich young men may account for the small peak in 1799.

We know in at least one case this was true. Ebenezer Townshend, Jr. records in the diary he kept of the Neptune's Voyage that while sealing in the Falkland Islands:

"In the middle of the winter we left James Ellis on one of the islands to take care of skins. He carelessly got out of fire and was without fifteen days. The principal inconvenience was he could not cook, [and] was obliged to eat his pork and limpets raw. He did not suffer from the cold. The fuel used by a sealing crew among the islands is the blubber or fat of the seals this makes them nearly as black as negroes. They cook the harslet with the fat of the seal both for fuel and fat and it tastes very much like hog's harslet. A sealing crew want a good stock of bread molasses and peas for coffee, and they can get along with little beef and pork, but to be out of bread or molasses for sweetening to their coffee is very uncomfortable. They get very much attached to what they call slops, which is tea and coffee, in this cold uncheerful country."<sup>2</sup>

The voyagers returned to New Haven on July 11, 1799. It is no wonder that we see in the records the marriage of "James Ellis & Elisabeth Cook, Oct., 1799". Fifteen days of raw pork and shell fish must have made a girl named Cook even more attractive.

### 3. Most Popular Names

The five most popular first names for women were Elisabeth (19), Sarah (13), Abigail (10), Hanna (9), and Anna (6) tied with Lois (6). The five most popular first names for men were John (19), Thomas (13), William (11), Samuel (8) and Joseph (7)

The five most common family names were Smith (11), Ward (8), Cook (6), Thompson (6), and Bonticue (5) tied with Forbes (5). There were four weddings involving the family names of Davis, Bradley, Frisbie, Perit, Prindle, Russel, Sherman, and Trowbridge.

### 4. Towns

In addition to New Haven, towns mentioned were Branford (14), West Haven (12), East Haven (4), Milford (3), Bristol (2), Fairfield (2) Guilford (2 times), Stratford (2), and Derby (1). This roughly reflects the influence of Trinity at the time, as Rev. Dr. Bela Hubbard, though originally from Clinton, Connecticut, was responsible for New Haven, Milford, West Haven, East Haven, and Branford.

### 5. "Negro" marriages

About 4.3% or eight marriages involved what Rev. Hubbard recorded as "negros". Five evidently involved two indentured "servants" (slaves), while 2 are between "free negros", and one marriage is recorded as "Sharper Rogers a free negro man & Phillis belonging to John Whiting Esq." A marriage between a free man and slave was unusual, and no doubt fraught with problems.

The most intriguing entry is, “Sharper a negro serv't & Wid. Elisabeth Wilford Jr.” Was this an unusual mixed race marriage of a male slave with his mistress? Of the 16 names in Hubbard’s records, he only identifies “free” five times, suggesting the others are slaves. This one time he identifies a “servant”, and it is paired with an apparently free widow whose race is not identified.

## 6. Table of Trinity Church on the Green Marriage Records 1768 – 1800

Baily’s transcription has a number of printing errors. Errors are marked with the original date ~~struck through~~ with the correct date or name following. Questionable dates are marked with a ? Additional information is in [brackets]. Keeping the original and the modern spelling allows for web searching on either spelling when using search engines. In some cases the spelling may have changes, or been idiosyncratic to Dr. Hubbard. The table has been sorted by date.
